JOB DESCRIPTION

Position:Dental DirectorImmediate Supervisor:Chief Health Officer

Position Summary:

A full-time, exempt position responsible for administering, maintaining and expanding primary and preventive dentistry in a community health center setting. The Dental Director supervises the dental staff of the community health center and reports to the CHO.

Essential Functions:

- 1. Examines individuals requesting dentistry, diagnoses dental/oral conditions, prescribes and carries out, or directs others in carrying out, appropriate oral health treatment, or refers individuals for specialty consultation or treatment in conformance with approved clinical protocols and guidelines for dentistry.
- 2. Records treatment procedures and examination as they occur in the patient's dental record so that the dental record accurately and completely reflects the nature of the contact, the condition of the patient and the care or treatment provided. In addition, the Dental Director shall complete referrals, data collections instruments and records or documentation as shall be required from time to time by the corporation.
- 3. Educates individuals in the nature of oral health related conditions and in the general promotion of oral health related disease prevention. General task include examining, x-rays, filling cavities, straightening teeth, repairing teeth, extracting teeth, and creating model teeth or dentures.
- 4. Serves on the dental staff and other center committees as assigned. Serves as Chair of the Dental Department's PI Committee and Peer Review Committee.
- 5. Prepares and submits monthly written reports on Dental Department clinical indicators and performance measures to the CEO or CHO.
- 6. Assists in the provision of continuing education, on-the-job training, and the orientation of community health center staff as requested.
- 7. Designs, develops, and implements appropriate Dental Department Policies, Protocols and Procedures that are in compliance with the most current accepted professional standards, including development of the Dental Emergency Response Protocol.
- 8. Assists in the provision of technical assistance and health education to the community as requested.

- 9. Assists in the preparation of an operating budget for the Dental Department and in conjunction with the Chief Financial Officer and the CEO with the Dental Department's budget. In addition, the Dental Director shall prepare special grant and project budgets as requested to meet the goals of the corporation.
- 10. Participates in short and long-term program planning for the Dental Department and the corporation, including developing goals and objectives.
- 11. Travels when necessary to fulfill the corporation's needs and attends meetings as necessary to represent the corporation and/or the Dental Department.
- 12. Participates in the preparation of grant applications for the corporation and assumes primary responsibility for developing and implementing the corporation's dental health care plan.
- 13. Assists in the coordination and integration of the corporation's dental programs and services with other corporate programs and services for the welfare of the corporation's patients.
- 14. Performs periodic evaluations of all Dental Department professional providers as directed by the policy of the corporation.
- 15. Supervises, advises, counsels and disciplines all Dental Department professional providers in conjunction with the CEO of the corporation and signs leave requests documents for Dental Department professional providers and ancillary staff.
- 16. Responsible for Departmental full compliance with all applicable federal, state, local and center rules, regulations, protocols and procedures governing the practice of dentistry and the clinical provision of dental care as well as those relating to, but not limited to, personnel issues, workplace safety, public health and confidentiality.
- 17. Participates in recruitment/retention activities of the corporation as necessary.
- 18. As directed by the CEO, performs other related and/or necessary tasks to achieve organizational and programmatic goals and objectives.
- 19. Verify all credentials of Dental personnel.

Education and Training:

- 1. Graduation from an accredited dental school.
- 2. Completion of an accredited general practice residency program is preferred.
- 3. Minimum of five years clinical experience preferred.
- 4. Ability to be clinically fluent in Spanish, helpful.
- 5. Knowledge of public health principles and practices preferred.
- 6. Administrative, management, PI, and budget development experience preferred.
- 7. Excellent interpersonal and written communication skills required.
- 8. Ability to maintain appropriate clinical privileges required, hospital privileges preferred.
- 9. FTCA coverage or private professional malpractice insurance obtainable.

Licensure and Credentials:

- 1. Unrestricted license to practice dentistry in the State of Louisiana (not applicable to commissioned NHSC/PHS officers).
- 2. Current CPR (BLS) certifications. ACLS preferred.
- 3. Louisiana DPS and DEA registrations.
- 4. Medicare and Medicaid provider numbers.
- 5. NPI number.

Skills and Abilities:

Requires a comprehensive knowledge of primary dental care in outpatient settings. Knowledge of the principles and practice of modern dentistry as related to public health organizations and community health programs, as well as current social and economic problems pertaining to public health and their impact on primary health care. The Dental Director must be cognizant of the prevalent stressors and their impact on both the professional provider and the patient populations in the community health center primary care settings. The individual in this position must also be aware of pressures, economic and otherwise, from private, public and legislative arenas as they mold the climate in which public health agencies operate. The Dental Director of the center must be able to achieve maximal productivity and programmatic effectiveness while continuously promoting the growth and development of fellow professionals, exercising appropriate supervisory control and displaying good work judgment.

Typical Physical Demands:

Prolonged sitting or standing is required. Physical movements and the degree of mobility normally associated with the practice of primary care dentistry will be performed on a repetitive basis. The ability to distinguish letters and symbols, as well as the ability to utilize telephones, computer terminals, and copiers is required. Frequent exposure to communicable diseases, body fluids, toxic substances, medicinal preparations, radiation and other conditions common to a clinical environment may routinely be encouraged.
