

Louisiana Primary Care Association Position Announcement

Position Title: Community Health Navigator

Overview:

The Louisiana Primary Care Association (LPCA) is conducting a job search for a Community Health Navigator (CHN) to assist with resources and care management of patients to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19, and to carry out other health work force-related activities. The CHN will provide individualized assistance to help strengthen patient support and assure utilization of patient portals.

Position Summary:

Serve as coordinator and liason between the patient and/or community member, with gaps in care including Health care and other social determinants of health services within the community. The CHNs will provide assistance with engagement on the use of patient portals, evaluate patients' health literacy and social service needs, identify and refer patients to supportive social service programs and provide case management and patient education to remove barriers to care.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Educate community members and their families about the sites and services provided within selected FQHC.
- 2. Assist in coordination and attend all FQHC community events and activities
- 3. Ability to develop trust and maintain positive relationships with internal teams, the community and social service agencies
- 4. Must have reliable transportation
- 5. Create opportunities of Memorandums of Understanding with other community organizations
- 6. Must be able to work some nights and weekends
- 7. Acquire required certifications and further training.
- 8. Coordinate and provide resources to the community.
- 9. Manage caseload assignments, draft a resource plan, review case progress and determine case closure
- 10. Reach or exceed monthly Case closure quota.
- 11. Collaborate with medical teams.
- 12. Follow up with patients via phone calls, "in community" and "In home" visits.
- 13. Submit weekly reports.
- 14. Maintain Events, training and meeting details in the team shared calendar
- 15. Maintains a high level of ethical conduct regarding confidentiality.
- 16. Adhere to professional standards as outlined by protocols, rules and regulations of Louisiana Primary Care Association
- 17. Resolve client barriers (e. g. transportation, translation services, apt. scheduling, communicating with providers).
- 18. Provide client education, guidance, and emotional support
- 19. Maintain a high level of ethical conduct regarding confidentiality.
