
Time & Talent

- You are responsible to log hours for your Time & Talent (Service Hours)

- For an item donated, count that as one hour of service.
- For time donated, count that as actual time spent.

CHILD PROTECTION

According to the Safe Environment/Child Protection Policy mandated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge, all parish and school ministry volunteers/chaperones must complete a mandatory background check and child protection training.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops revised the child protection policies. Please note that all volunteers that have a child protection file must update their file with the revised forms in order to maintain their child protection credentials.

Child protection files that are not updated will be closed during the database sweep in the summer. The update consists of the revised <u>Code of Ethics (12-31-2019)</u> and the online child protection training certificate for <u>Serving Vulnerable Populations</u>.

The <u>Chaperone and Volunteer Requirements Agreement 2020-2021</u> has been attached also.. Please mark the 2020-2021 grade level of each child in the Class section. Two hours may be counted on your Time and Talent card for updating your child protection file.

Please scan and email the updated paperwork to <u>childprotection@mbsbr.org</u>. New Volunteer New Volunteer Applications are being accepted at this time. Anyone that has not completed the child protection process for MBS School previously, please email your volunteer request to <u>childprotection@mbsbr.org</u>.

Five hours may be counted towards your Time and Talent hours completing the child protection process.




