Call for Candidates — COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

Qualifying deadline: Friday, April 29



The term of office for the Board of Trustees member who represents colleges and universities will expire December 31, 2022. An election will be held this year to fill a new four-year term, which begins January 2023.

If you are interested in representing your fellow TRSL members, you must first meet eligibility

requirements and submit a letter of intent to qualify as a candidate.

Eligibility requirements:

You must be an active member of TRSL who is employed by a state college or university in Louisiana (includes members who are participating in DROP or working after DROP).

NOTE: Individuals employed in the field of higher education who participate in the Optional Retirement Plan (ORP) are <u>not</u> members of TRSL's Regular Plan, and therefore are ineligible to run or vote in TRSL Board elections.

To qualify, you must send your letter of intent to TRSL by U.S. Certified Mail, U.S. Registered Mail, U.S. Express Mail, or other mail carrier that requires proof of delivery.

No other method of delivery will be accepted.

The letter must be in TRSL's office by 4:30 p.m., Friday, April 29.

Letter of intent should include:

- Name as you would like it to appear on the ballot
- Daytime telephone number
- Email address
- Place of employment
- Job classification/title
- Last four digits of your Social Security number (to verify TRSL membership)
- Biographical statement/curriculum vitae (250-word limit)
- Personal statement (75-word limit)
