Funds from the 2019 Champions FORE Health Golf Tournament assisted in the following:

- **1,541** men screened for **tobacco use** and provided **cessation intervention**
- **463** men screened for **depression** and provided a follow-up plan as clinically indicated
- **2,660** men navigated to **colorectal cancer screening**
- **1,129** men completed **HIV screening**
- **57.8%** of men with **hypertension** are controlled
- **67.1%** of men with **diabetes** are controlled
- **607** men screened for **Hepatitis C**
- **1,098** men provided an **annual wellness exam**



Our Community Health Navigators (CHN)

participated in **128 community outreach events**, assisting more than 14,000 people with matters related to social determinants of health, such as housing, food, employment and more.
