Prayers

Litany: An Invitation to Turning *(adapted from the Jewish Selichot Service)*

Leader: Create in us a clean heart, and place a willing spirit within us.

All: **Shed your light upon us, O God, that we may see the goodness in each of your children.**

Leader: For we have sinned against life by failing to work for peace.

All: **We have sinned against life by keeping silent in the face of injustice.**

Leader: For we have sinned against life by ignoring those who suffer.

All: **We have sinned against life by forgetting those in need in our own midst.**

Leader: Sovereign God, whose throne is mercy. You guide the world with steadfast love, forgiving the transgressions of your people; You pardon all who sin, are generous with all who live, treating them with compassion.

All: **May the source of strength, who blessed the ones before us, help us find the courage to make our lives a blessing and let us say, Amen.**

2020 Lent Series: Listen!

Readings are from the Revised Common Lectionary

March 1 First Sunday in Lent

Reading: Matthew 4:11-11

Lent traditionally begins with the reading of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness. Jesus faced three tests which might draw him away from God. In life, we too face many tests.

Question: "To whom are we listening?"

March 8 Second Sunday in Lent

Reading: Genesis 12:1-4a

Abram was called by God to go from his country to a new land. "So Abram went." He left that which was familiar as he responded to God's call.

Question: "When it comes to listening, how might we be more open like Abram?"

March 15 Third Sunday in Lent

Reading: John 4:5-42

Jesus defied culture and tradition by interacting with the Samaritan woman at the well. Time and time again, Jesus modeled how to listen to someone different from him.

Question: What are the benefits to listening to someone different from us—for us and them?

March 22 Fourth Sunday in Lent

Reading: John 9:1-41

Jesus healed a man blind from birth on the Sabbath. This healing caused quite a controversy and stirred much conflict.

Question: "In the midst of conflict, what might help us to continue to be open to listening to the "other"?"

March 29 Fifth Sunday in Lent

Jesus wept. His friend Lazarus had died. That's not the end of the story, but it is powerful to hear of Jesus sharing this very human moment with Mary, Martha and the other mourners.

Question: What does it mean to accompany others through sorrow and at the same time listen to our own grief?

Holy Week: How are we being led to listen?
