

Jeff Shafer is a frequent speaker and writer on the intersection of law, the U.S. Constitution, and the nature of marriage and the family. Until last Fall, he was senior counsel with Alliance Defending Freedom, where he practiced law for 16 years. During his time at ADF, Shafer litigated a number of cases and was a member of the Center for Cultural Engagement and Scholarship where he devotes his efforts to strategic research and innovation.

During the course of his legal career, Jeff has litigated public-interest and First Amendment cases in federal and state trial and appellate courts throughout the United States. His litigation work has included ballot-access cases for citizen initiatives, including the 2004 Ohio Marriage Amendment; asserting the rights of parents to home-educate their children, including the *In Re Rachel L.* case in California; vindicating the rights of religious institutions under the federal Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act; and advocating the First Amendment speech, religion, and associational liberties of university students who were penalized for their viewpoints.

Mr. Shafer earned his Doctor of Jurisprudence, with honors, from Regent University Law School in 1995. He is admitted to the bar in Ohio and Illinois, as well as the U.S. Supreme Court, and numerous federal district and appellate courts.
