



2026 SLIDING FEE SCALE DISCOUNT NOTICE

As a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), Priority Health Care (PHC) is required to provide a Sliding Fee Scale Discount Program to patients who meet the eligibility guidelines.

Further, it is the policy of PHC to provide quality health care regardless of the patient's ability to pay.

Discounts are offered based upon household income and size. A Sliding Fee Schedule is used to calculate the basic discount and is updated on an annual basis using the current federal poverty guidelines. Once approved, the discount will be honored for up to one year, after which the patient must reapply.

Sliding Fee Discounts are determined based upon household size and annual income, regardless of health insurance status.

Note: Priority Health Care uses income levels based on the 2026 HHS Poverty Guidelines to decide what help a patient may get with costs. This means the amount you earn compared with your household size helps show what you can pay. Even if someone has trouble paying, they are not denied care. The clinic still asks for co-pays, deductibles, and sliding fee payments when those apply, but the goal is to keep care within reach. For many patients, the sliding fee scale lowers the cost of care for households earning up to 200% of the federal poverty level. That means if a family's income is low enough, they may pay less for services. For HIV-positive patients, there is also extra help through the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program. Some patients with household incomes at or below 500% of the federal poverty level may qualify for this support, and they may have a yearly limit on what they pay out of pocket. Once they reach that cap, their costs stop at that amount for the year. The best next step is to speak with a Social Services staff member. They can check whether you qualify and help track your out-of-pocket cap. If paperwork feels confusing, they can walk you through it in plain language, one step at a time.
