- Please create a name tag with the Saint's name, as well as your child's grade on • *it*. We will line up the children by grade level for the procession into Church.
- A **GROUP PHOTO** will be taken at the end of Mass and parents will be able to take a photo, too.
- After Mass, your child will walk back to school with their class as usual, remove their costume in their homeroom and store it in their locker.
