



Since we will begin setting up the Fairgrounds next week, we must adjust the way our "normal" carpool runs in both the morning and afternoon.


The map below will help you understand the written instructions on the next two pages.



AM & PM Carpool Instructions for Tuesday, October 19-Friday, October 22

Morning Carpool


- From Jefferson Hwy, turn onto **Director** by Animal Crackers Learning Center. *DO NOT Turn into the Church Parking lot*.
- Continue on Director and turn right on **President**.
- Turn right onto **Currency**. This road will feed directly into the school parking lot entrance.
- Cross **Baringer Rd** and enter the school parking lot. (Please be sure to wait on Currency if the lot is full. We do not want to block Baringer from the buses or those exiting carpool.)
- Enter the second row of the parking lot and begin following the cones to snake through the parking lot. Faculty will be there to direct you.
- At the last set of parking spaces, you will enter the carpool line.
- Please be sure that your child is unbuckled and ready to exit the vehicle when you reach the Teacher or Safety Patrol student.
- Exit the school parking lot as you normally would for carpool.




AM & PM Carpool Instructions for Tuesday, October 19-Friday, October 22

Afternoon Carpool

- From Jefferson Hwy, turn onto **Director** by Animal Crackers Learning Center. *DO NOT Turn into the Church Parking lot*.
- Continue on Director and turn right on **President**.
- Turn right onto **Currency**. This road will feed directly into the school parking lot entrance.
- Cross **Baringer Rd** and enter the school parking lot. (Please be sure to wait on Currency if the lot is full. We do not want to block Baringer from the buses or those exiting carpool.)
- Follow the cones through the parking lot and follow the teacher's directions to enter the parking spaces.
- Pull in to the parking spot so that you are facing the carpool line and can drive forward to enter the line.
- A teacher will then enter your Car Rider Pro tag number. All tags should be displayed on the rearview mirror and visible for the teacher to see.
- On the teacher's motion enter the carpool line and proceed as normal.
- Exit the school parking lot as you normally would for carpool.



a note from the



I think we can all agree that technology is a blessing and a curse.

The blessing is that technology has made many things much easier.

The curse, in my opinion, is that it has exposed our children to many things that they are not emotionally ready for.

As a parent, it was very easy to give my children electronics as it entertained them, kept them quiet and busy and allowed me to get work done without interruption. I saw firsthand how the lure of electronics could easily consume a young person's life.

As an educator, I see students addicted to electronics. It has affected so many aspects of their lives - social interactions, behavior, academics, sleep patterns and communication skills just to name a few.

Several years ago, we polled our students to see who had cell phones. At MBS we had students as young as 2nd grade who acknowledged having telephones.

Last week, a fellow principal shared the letter below with me. I found it very timely and wanted to share it with you.

In addition to the message it imparts, I want to add that social media via electronics has allowed children and adults to become emboldened. We no longer need to look someone in the face when communicating with them or hear their voice via a conversation. Many, simply send off an email or text without truly thinking of how it may affect the person receiving it. We have forgotten to communicate with respect and kindness. Let us always remember that there is a real person on the other side of that communication, and we must continue to respect their feelings. This is an important lesson we need to model and teach our children.

The Phone

This phone belongs to my 14 year old daughter. It's charging on my kitchen counter. At 9pm, every single night, her phone shuts itself down and she brings it here. Why? It's how I keep her safe.

That phone is free of social media. She has an app that allows her to chat with a handful of friends and family. I know every person she talks to, and I check her phone and messages regularly. Why? It's how I'm keeping her safe.

My nearly 12-year-old son asked me two days ago if I would connect his PS4 to the internet so he could play with friends outside of the house. I said no. He had a persuasive argument; it was filled with many things I agree with him about. Unfortunately, the good does not outweigh the bad. So, I stuck with the original "no." Why? It's how I am keeping him safe.

These devices, left unchecked, will allow people into our homes at any hour of any day. There is no escape. And I've created this home to be an escape. It's a safe place for my children. No matter what happens out in the world, I want this house to be their respite, their safe haven, their fortress.

Opening the door to unrestricted internet access allows anyone to enter our home at any time. I'm locking that door.

When it comes to internet access here there is zero privacy. ZERO. I've listened to arguments about privacy, and I've not heard a single one that made me rethink the safety of my children.

It's not only their physical safety we are called to guard! We must guard their hearts, their eyes, and their ears until they can make their own rational decisions. I'm doubling down rather than easing up on this issue. Why? Because I've read countless stories of parents who wish they could undo what's been done.

There are children- CHILDREN- sending pics, videos and other inappropriate content of themselves to "friends" online. And it's not happening out there somewhere- it's happening in good, solid Christian homes. It's happening right under our noses. The fallout of this crisis is yet to be seen. Our boys are exposed to inappropriate content and pornography years earlier than their fathers and the consequences are immeasurable.

Parents, educate yourselves on the long- term damage of early pornography exposure. I know the old adages bring comfort "boys will be boys." But I call bull. We are excusing life altering behavior by assuming that it's "just what boys do." No longer is it magazine photos of girls they will never meet- it's inappropriate pics of girls in their schools.

This is not fear mongering or helicopter parenting, it's simply common sense.

Check the phones. Monitor their online presence. If you allow social media, make sure you're one of their most engaged followers. They probably won't like that. You'll get some pushback. Parent anyway.

I tell my children all the time "I'm not here to make friends. It's okay with me if this makes you unhappy. Why? It's how I'm keeping them safe.

Circle of Grace - Safe Environment Training Program

The USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People requires that all children enrolled in Catholic Schools and Parish Schools of Religion receive Safe Environment training. Parent's Commitment to Church and School One of the requirements for enrollment and/or retention at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School is a commitment to the following agreement.

- In addition to daily prayer at home, the Catholic members of our family will attend Mass every weekend and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent will be given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year.
- A minimum amount of \$325.00 will be donated to the Church to support the stewardship program as an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG). IOGs will receive in-parish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the following school year.

Definition of an Hour

One (1) hour is defined as an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10.

New Students Clause

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.




