Enrollment for 2024-25

Existing Kindergarten-7th Grade Students

- All students (K-7) who will remain at MBS for 2024-25 school year MUST RE-ENROLL through FACTS Family Portal.
- If your student will not return, please UNENROLL.
- Re-Enrollment takes place 1/8-1/13. The fee is \$375. After the 13th, a \$100 Late Fee will be added. The re-enrollment fee is non-refundable.
- Tuition is not deducted in January due to this Re-enrollment fee.

How to Re-enroll, January 8-13

- All existing K-7 students who will attend school for the 24-25 school year must Re-enroll during this time period.
- If your student will not return, please login and "unenroll" during this time period.
- Have your FACTS login information. Reminder: District Code is MBS-LA.
- Login to FACTS Family Portal.
- Click Apply/Enroll>Enrollment/Reenrollment, and begin the Reenrollment process.
- There is a Reenrollment fee of \$375 per student.
- Those who miss the deadline of the 13th will be charged a \$100 late fee, for a total of \$475/student.
- Spirit shirt sizes are communicated for the upcoming school year during Re-Enrollment.

Existing PK Students

- PK Students who applied to Kindergarten in November will be notified of acceptance on February 19.
- Tuition is not deducted in January.
- February 19-March 4, accepted students will be asked to "Enroll" in FACTS. Enrollment fee is \$375 and is non-refundable.

While on vacation, a colleague of mine noticed a group of people huddled together on the beach near the dunes. It looked like a class of some sort and as she watched, she realized that the group was actually part of the volunteers who carefully guard the sea turtle nests and their migration to the ocean. They were watching a nest of sea turtles hatch and emerge from deep in the sand to begin their trek to the ocean! This usually happens only at night!!

She quickly joined the group as these tiny creatures pulled themselves out of the deep sand and started the long hike to the ocean. The tide was low and the ocean a very long way from the dunes, especially for these little guys. She latched on a few of them and accompanied them on their journey. As she watched them, she found herself feeling anxious as they encountered one hurtle after another on their way. There were footprints from morning walkers filled with water that one of the turtles fell in and flipped over desperately flailing his legs to recover and crawl out of the hole. Another little guy fell into a crab hole and disappeared for a few minutes. When he began to surface it seemed like a never-ending task to get out and resume the journey. He even started walking the wrong way!

Each time she watched the turtles face these obstacles, her anxiety increased and she felt the urge to intervene and help them on their way! She couldn't just pick them up and take them to the ocean and set them on their way? Then as they finally reached the ocean, the waves kept batting them around - out under and back to the beach, flipping them over and over again several time before they finally disappeared into the ocean.

She turned to one of the volunteers and said – "Whew life starts out so hard!" She asked the volunteer if they ever helped these turtles during this first part of their life. The volunteer looked at her and said "Oh NO!". This part of the journey seems hard but is necessary as they face the bigger challenges ahead."

Oh – so very true. As she reflected, she was reminded of the importance of developing our internal muscle – the one that allows us to be able to stand with people as they face life's struggles and not rob them of the opportunity to learn and grow through tough circumstances. She thought of the many times that her anxiety got in the way as she watched a person struggle in life. She was also reminded that it has been during her most painful struggles that she learned and grew the most.

As I reflect on this story on the last day of exams I know that is has been difficult watching our students, your children work hard, even struggle as they balanced end of the quarter assessments and extracurricular activities and studied for exams. I share this story to remind us to "Don't steal the struggle" of others. Remember, oftentimes our children grow the most from what they have learned during their most painful struggles. Struggles help them to develop grit and stick-to-itiveness and ultimately shape their future.

Parent's Commitment to Church and School

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- <u>Prayer and Mass</u> Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 *to receive the in-parish tuition rate*. These hours are reviewed each year.

Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10

• <u>Weekly Church Offering</u> – As an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG), a minimum amount of \$325.00 must be donated, yearly, to the Most Blessed Sacrament General Offertory or Building Fund to support the Church stewardship program. Church members who meet the IOG requirement *will receive inparish tuition*. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor or Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the next school year.

New Students Clause

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.

Log your Service Hours into FACTS.

Go to Family > Family Home. You will see "Service Hours" in the middle of the screen. Click "add" to add the hours. You must type in a description. Select "type a custom value," and then type your description.
