The school calendar is an ongoing, always-changing <u>site</u>. Please take note of all of the events, but especially:


- Monthly Spirit Shirt Days students are invited to wear this year's spirit shirt with uniform bottoms. They will be distributed in August.

# **Carpool Procedures & Reminders**

- Morning carpool begins at 7:20 and ends at 7:45. Students are tardy thereafter. After assembly, students must be checked in the office with a guardian.
- Students needing to be dropped off after 7:20 must do so through the carpool line.
- For safety purposes, we ask that you not drop off or pick up any student in the parking lot, the rear parking lot, or on the gravel lot on Baringer.
- New families will receive two carpool tags. Everyone needs to have a carpool tag on those days that we have early dismissal, or no bus days. Additional carpool tags can be ordered by completing the following <u>form</u> and turning it & your money in to Mrs. Vonnie.
- All carpool traffic must enter the campus through the CHURCH parking lot on Jefferson Hwy. Two lines form and turn into one line at the CAR RIDER PRO TAG READER sign. {{Afternoon carpool: Do not enter the single-line through the car rider tag reader until 2:30.}}
- To assist in keeping cars from backing up onto Jefferson Highway, a double line is to be formed in heavy traffic. Cars are to stay to the right (Woodlawn High side) and proceed in a single line to the rear gate entrance of the school campus. The left Church entrance is for Church use only.
- Each car proceeds into the SCHOOL parking lot through the gate adjacent to the Multi-Purpose Building. Continue to proceed until directed to stop. Please do not stop for folks walking through the lot. They will pass through once you are stopped at your drop-off location. {{Afternoon carpool: proceed to an open, colored cone.}}
- Allow the teacher on duty or the Safety Patrol student to open the door.
- Afternoon carpool begins at 2:50 and ends at 3:15. Students remaining on campus will be sent to Extended Care for a fee.
- Students will be given a procedure to assemble for afternoon carpool. Students will
  only be loaded into the vehicle from the passenger side. Parents are not to get out of
  their vehicle at any time when the line is in motion. Parents are to adhere to these
  guidelines for the safety and efficient movement of all involved in afternoon carpool

# **Carpool Reminders**

- No cell phones are to be used during carpool.
- If you do not have your tag, you will be asked to park in the lot and wait until the end of carpool to get your child from the Teacher on Duty.
- Students must exit car from the Passenger Side. If you stop in the church parking lot to move kids around, please do not stop in the middle of carpool lines.
- Please maintain the cleanliness of your vehicle. We have had personal items fall out of the car and roll under the car, causing delays in carpool.
- Please be kind to the Safety Patrol Crew. They have been waiting outside just as long as you have been waiting in line.



# **School Mass**

The first school Mass will be on Thursday, August 15, which is also a Holy Day of Obligation. Dress uniforms are required for all school Masses. Due to the excessive heat Louisiana experiences in August, regular uniforms may be worn (even on Mass Days) until September 30. Students are allowed to wear jumpers without a shirt and shorts on Mass days. Beginning October 1st, complete dress uniforms will be required for Mass.

#### OFFICE OF CHILD PROTECTION

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People requires that all children enrolled in Catholic Schools and Parish Schools of Religion receive Safe Environment training. The Diocese of Baton Rouge will provide such training for grades K-12 utilizing the program, Circle of Grace.

The Circle of Grace lessons are grade-level appropriate lessons mandated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge to instruct students on topics of personal safety, making good decisions, developing wholesome relationships, and self-esteem. # Fime & Talent (Service Hours

#### Parent's Commitment to Church and School

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- <u>Prayer and Mass</u> Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year.

Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10

Weekly Church Offering – As an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG), a minimum amount of \$325.00 must be donated, yearly, to the Most Blessed Sacrament General Offertory or Building Fund to support the Church stewardship program. Church members who meet the IOG requirement will receive inparish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor or Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the next school year.

#### **New Students Clause**

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.
