OFFICE OF CHILD PROTECTION

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People requires that all children enrolled in Catholic Schools and Parish Schools of Religion receive Safe Environment training. The Diocese of Baton Rouge will provide such training for grades K-12 utilizing the program, Circle of Grace.

The Circle of Grace lessons are grade-level appropriate lessons mandated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge to instruct students on topics of personal safety, making good decisions, developing wholesome relationships, and self-esteem. Classlink is an easy way to access all of the learning applications that your child uses at school. Students access all of their applications with a single username and password. Classlink makes it easier for students to log on so that they have more time to learn and teachers have more time to teach.

Parent's Commitment to Church and School

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- <u>Prayer and Mass</u> Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year.

Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10

Weekly Church Offering – As an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG), a minimum amount of \$325.00 must be donated, yearly, to the Most Blessed Sacrament General Offertory or Building Fund to support the Church stewardship program. Church members who meet the IOG requirement will receive inparish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor or Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the next school year.

New Students Clause

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.

Log your Service Hours into FACTS.

Go to Family > Family Home.
You will see "Service Hours" in
the middle of the screen. Click
"add" to add the hours. You
must type in a description.
Select "type a custom value,"
and then type your description.

Sending Items to School

Please label your items that you send to school from a SignUp Genius:

- Parent Name (signed up on the SUG)
- Name of item
- Title of Sign Up (ex: 5th Grade Auction Basket)

This helps us match your hours in FACTS.



Everyone Needs Community

"Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." – Hebrews 13:1-2

The Bible consistently advocates for the inclusion of the marginalized, the outcast, and those on the fringes of society, and Jesus' ministry was marked by such acts of inclusion, like reaching out to those often overlooked or shunned. We believe in fostering a caring and inclusive environment for all students, and one of the ways we can achieve this is by encouraging our children to reach out to their peers who may feel lonely or isolated. Here are some tips and strategies for parents to help their children develop empathy and kindness towards others.

Why It's Important

- Promotes Empathy: Reaching out to lonely kids helps children develop empathy and understanding of others' feelings.
- Builds a Positive School and Church Community: Encouraging inclusivity and kindness creates a welcoming and supportive environment for everyone.
- Improves Social Skills: Interacting with different peers helps children enhance their social skills, make new friends, and increase your child's self-esteem and confidence.

How You Can Help

- 1) Model Kindness and Empathy: Show kindness in your daily interactions and discuss why it's important. Share stories of times when you reached out to someone who was lonely and the positive impact it had.
- 2) Talk About Feelings: Have regular conversations with your child about their feelings and the feelings of others. Teach them to recognize signs that someone might be feeling lonely, such as sitting alone or looking sad.
- 3) Encourage Inclusive Behavior: Encourage your child to invite classmates who are alone to join in activities or games. Suggest they say hello, smile, or ask how someone is doing.
- 4) Praise Positive Behavior: Acknowledge and praise your child when they make an effort to include others and show kindness. Discuss how their actions made a positive difference for someone else.
- 5) Get Involved in School/ Church Activities: Encourage participation in group activities, clubs, or sports where they can interact with a variety of peers. Volunteer for school or church events to set an example of community involvement and support.
- 6) Discuss Diversity: Encourage them to be riend class mates from diverse backgrounds and experiences.

By encouraging your child to reach out to others, you are helping to create a more compassionate and connected school/ church community. Your guidance and support can make a significant impact on your child's social development and the well-being of their peers.
