#### **Upcoming Charges on FACTS account**

- Due to accounting, all fees will no longer be dispersed over 11 months with tuition, but will be withdrawn at Enrollment. Enrollment takes place in January of each year. As a reminder, there is no tuition deducted in January.
- **Security Fee** is applied to families to staff a Baton Rouge sheriff Office deputy on campus from 6am to 6pm while the students are present. Custom Security 24/7 cameras to monitor the campus is also included in the fee. This fee will be drafted in October and November for the 2024-25 school year. \$137.50 will be deducted in October; \$137.50 will be deducted in November as an "incidental fee."
- Effective January 2025, all 2025-2026 fees will be due at enrollment. In January, the following 25-26 fees will be drafted:
  - <u>Enrollment fee \$375.</u> After the enrollment deadline, the enrollment fee increases to \$475 per student for returning students.
  - <u>Technology fee of \$275</u>. This fee is assessed to students to cover all technology, which not only applies
    to the cost of student chrome books, but also to online textbooks licenses, subscriptions to ClassLink and
    all its components.
  - Security fee of \$275. see above for explanation of this fee.
  - Facts fee of \$55. A Facts payment plan must be set up during enrollment process.
  - <u>Capital Maintenance Fee of \$400</u> per family if applicable. This fee is assessed to families who are not
    identified offertory givers of MBS Church, those who are registered at another church parish, and/or
    those who are non-Catholic.
- The PK First Grade Fee and the 8th Grade Class Fee will be drafted with the first tuition payment for the 2025-2026 school year, which will be in June of 2025.

#### **Conference Days**

As needed conferences are scheduled with parents of students in grades PK-8th grade. If a child's teacher does not request a conference, and the parent would like to meet, a conference may be requested. Students do not attend school on their scheduled conference day.

Please take note of the no school days.

On <u>Friday, September 27</u>, PK-5 grade will have parent/teacher conferences, so those students will not attend school. Middle School students will attend on this day.

On <u>Monday, September 30</u>, Middle School will have parent/teacher conferences, so those students will not attend school. Students PK-5 grade will attend on this day.

According to the Safe Environment Policy promulgated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge, all parish and school ministry volunteers/chaperones must complete a mandatory background check and child protection training. Child Protection credentials allow the holder of these credentials the opportunity to chaperone/volunteer.

All credentialed adults must abide by the sign-up and confirmation process for each event.

# Fime & Talent (Service Hours

#### Parent's Commitment to Church and School

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- <u>Prayer and Mass</u> Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year.

Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10

Weekly Church Offering – As an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG), a minimum amount of \$325.00 must be donated, yearly, to the Most Blessed Sacrament General Offertory or Building Fund to support the Church stewardship program. Church members who meet the IOG requirement will receive inparish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor or Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the next school year.

#### **New Students Clause**

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.
