### Dear Parents:

October 28-November 1 is Red Ribbon Week. During Red Ribbon Week, we participate in a national campaign focusing on positive, healthy choices to remain drug-free. October is also National Bullying Prevention Month. Red Ribbon Week will include lessons and messages to promote kindness and prevent bullying.

Our theme this year is "Say **BOO** to bad choices!" The week will be filled with activities and treats, however, stickers, pencils, and lollipops don't change behavior. It takes a real partnership between school and family to increase awareness and reinforce positive decisions. Here are some ways you as parents can help keep your children safe and drug-free:

- 1. Talk to your children about your rules and expectations often, not just one time.
- 2. Take advantage of when you encounter ads, shows, songs, and other media that can help you introduce the topics of drug use and bullying in a natural, unforced way.
- 3. Model safe, healthy choices and kind, respectful behavior.
- 4. Supervise, supervise, supervise!
- 5. Spend screen-free time with your family, particularly around the dinner table. Research shows that quality family meal time correlates with healthier, positive life choices and overall success.

We look forward to a great Red Ribbon Week! As the week progresses, ask your children about our healthy choices activities, such as the poster contest, student presentations, and any other surprises along the way! To incorporate the bullying prevention theme, middle schoolers will be reading picture books about friendship and kindness to grades PK-4 throughout the week, as well.

We will also have one "dress up" day. On Wednesday, October 30th, MBS will participate in Wear Red Day. Your children can wear red shirts, red socks, and other red accessories, with their uniform bottoms.

Thank you for your role in prevention for your children, for our community, and for our future! Let's say "BOO" to bad choices for safe, kind, and drug-free kids!

# OFFICE OF CHILD PROTECTION

According to the Safe Environment Policy promulgated by the Diocese of Baton Rouge, all parish and school ministry volunteers/chaperones must complete a mandatory background check and child protection training. Child Protection credentials allow the holder of these credentials the opportunity to chaperone/volunteer.

All credentialed adults must abide by the sign-up and confirmation process for each event.

# **Update Your Volunteer File**

Please note that the Code of Ethics and the Chaperone and Volunteer Requirements Agreement must be reviewed by all volunteers of MBS School annually as required by the Diocese of Baton Rouge. Please complete and submit the Code of Ethics Acknowledgement form, page 5, and the Agreement form to the MBS Office of Child Protection to update your file.

# Parent's Commitment to Church and School

Enrollment and/or continued enrollment at Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic School requires a commitment to ALL of the following:

- <u>Prayer and Mass</u> Families must commit to daily prayer at home. Catholic families must attend weekly, Sunday, Mass on Holy Days of Obligation. Non-Catholic families must attend Sunday services at their home church.
- <u>Service</u> Twenty (20) hours of Time and Talent given to the school and/or Church each year. Hours must be completed between January 1 and December 31 to receive the in-parish tuition rate. These hours are reviewed each year.

Definition of an hour of Time and Talent: an actual hour of volunteer work or donation purchases of \$10

Weekly Church Offering – As an Identified Offertory Giver (IOG), a minimum amount of \$325.00 must be donated, yearly, to the Most Blessed Sacrament General Offertory or Building Fund to support the Church stewardship program. Church members who meet the IOG requirement will receive inparish tuition. Donations will be verified by December 15 unless otherwise authorized by the Pastor or Principal. Any offerings thereafter will count towards the next school year.

### **New Students Clause**

Time and Talent hours are prorated for new students. However, new families must still meet the IOG requirement of \$325.00 to receive in-parish tuition.
