Items needed:

- baby shampoo/conditioner, baby lotion, baby powder, adult shampoo/conditioner, soap, wet wipes, new children's socks, disposable diapers (newborn, toddler, pullups) disposable sippy/juice cups, instant fruit drink mix
- unopened small size items such as bars of soap, shampoo, deodorants, lotions, toothpaste, toothbrushes, disposable razors, etc. We will also accept unopened hotel toiletries.
