<u>Jill Peno Scholarship</u>



Jill Peno was an MBS student who passed away during her eighth-grade year after being diagnosed with a brain tumor. To honor her memory, the Jill Peno Memorial Scholarship is awarded each year to a seventh-grade student that models Jill's outstanding qualities.

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

Ring in the New Year by Living your Faith

As we enter 2021, it is no doubt that we are leaving a very tough year behind. That is the beauty of a new year. We can start over. As we look to our faith reconciliation is also a way of starting over. It allows us to give our transgressions to God and look forward to doing better tomorrow. Looking ahead how can we do better? How can we expand our capacity for living out our holiness? Here are some ideas that can be easily incorporated into our daily lives. I challenge you to join me in living your faith this year, with intention.

- 1. When using a gift, say a prayer for the giver. For example, every time you use that milk-frother from you mother, say a short prayer for her or simply ask God to watch over her.
- 2. Commit random acts of kindness which can include random moments of prayer for someone.
- 3. Make a weekly appointment with Jesus by visiting the tabernacle or adoration. The more time you spend with Him, the more you receive from Him. (Matthew 7:10)
- 4. Bounce-back Whatever you do for others comes back to you.
- 5. Become invisible Look for invisible ways to do good examples skip the closest parking, leaving it for someone else, put away a shopping cart that has been left out. God will see what you have done in secret and will reward you. (Matthew 6:6.)
- 6. Read the Bible Just open it and read a verse each day.
- 7. Give praise to an employee at a local store. Better yet tell their supervisor. Even better yet, pray for them.
- 8. Fast everyday by skipping fries, ketchup, butter. Sacrifice something you take for granted.
- 9. When waiting (for anything,) say a prayer.
- 10. End every in-person purchase with "thank you and God bless." Pray for them as you leave or they leave you.
- 11. Use the sound of sirens, flashing lights and funeral processions as a time to pause for prayer for those who are responding and those who are suffering. If in the car, pull off the road, silence your radio and respectfully pray. I once worked with a teacher whose school was on a busy street, near a hospital. Every time an ambulance would pass by, her students immediately stopped what they were doing and made the sign of the cross.
- 12. Get over yourself. Thank God for your failure and let Him take the lead.
- 13. Get to know the saint of the day, pray for Church members who have joined the Church or have celebrated the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, First Eucharist, Confirmation, Marriage, Holy Orders or those who have died.
- 14. Donate something personal that you love to someone.
- 15. Wear a sign of your faith, crucifix, medal, rosary bracelet. It is a witness to your faith.
- 16. Fast from social media, coffee, wearing jewelry, (anything but make sure it is something you love.)
- 17. Have a no-complaint day each week. EVERYTHING counts, even weather and exhaustion.
- 18. Invite a priest to dinner and ask him to bless your house, family, and meal.
- 19. Praise people sincerely and unexpectedly.
- 20. Give unexpected gifts...it does not have to be large. Treat someone to a coffee, bring them a muffin for breakfast, put a tray of cookies in the break room, bring cookies to the fire station. It's the thought that counts.
