#### **Biblical Foundation**

- Key Text: Hebrews 10:24-25
- Key Principles: 3 Words That Describe Biblically Authentic Christian Community
  - o Intimacy We grow in Christ and with one another the more we are together.
  - o <u>Inspiration</u> We uplift one another on purpose with divine purpose.
  - Influence We pursue good works because of the encouragement of other like-minded believers.
- Why should we prioritize biblically authentic Christian community?
  - Our Creator eternally <u>exists</u> in community. (Genesis 1:26)
  - We are divinely <u>designed</u> for community. (Genesis 2:18)
  - $\circ\quad \mbox{Our faith is primarily } \underline{\mbox{\bf practiced}} \mbox{ and } \underline{\mbox{\bf developed}} \mbox{ in community.}$ 
    - Acts 2:42-46; Ephesians 4:1-16, 25-32; 5:15-21
- Why do some Christians neglect community?
  - o Intentional Isolation (Proverbs 18:1-2)
    - Isolation comes from <u>restrictions</u> based on personal preferences.
    - Isolation comes from <u>misconceptions</u> based on flawed perspectives.
  - o Inconvenience
  - o Fear
  - No models or examples

  - o Ecclesiastes 4:9-12
    - Support, strength, and safety
  - o James 5:13-16
    - Help, hope, and healing

- o Invite. Seek the counsel of a wise believer you trust to share honestly with you which of the key relationships you may be lacking at this time.
- o Be Honest. If you have a deeper issue that requires counseling, be honest with yourself and get the help you need.
