SUBJECT: THE HOLY SPIRIT AS HE RELATES TO THE CHURCH

Introduction: The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Trinity. He presents sinners with the Claims of Christ and gives power to the Saved who are in Christ Jesus. 4. The Holy Spirit helps the believer to overcome worry – Philippians 4:6-7.
5. The Holy Spirit helps us to strive for excellence – Philippians 4:13.
6. The Holy Spirit is our teacher – Saint John 14:26.
