Our Response to the Mission of God

- 1.) We Must **Know** Christ (John 17:20-26)
- 2.) We Must **Embrace** His Mission (Isaiah 6:8)
- 3.) We Must **Prioritize** His Mission (Matthew 6:24; Luke 14:25-27, 33)

Big Idea

The mission of God must be our first priority every day and everywhere. If it's not our top priority, then it will end up being not a priority at all.

Our Mission Field

Now we're going to talk about our mission field

- When you hear the words Mission Trip, you would immediately think of someplace to Go. That place is usually away from home.
- But Missions isn't just away, it's also at home.
- In Acts 1:8, Jesus gives the disciples a strategy to start at home and continue to spread the news farther away.
- But Jesus didn't expect 12 disciples to go all around the world, He expected disciples to make disciples who will spread the Gospel all around the world.
- Our mission field is where God has placed us, so today I'd like to give us a real picture of the challenges and opportunities of reaching lost people where we are.

Key Text: Romans 1:18-32

- I. The Culture
 - o Spiritual **Blindness** (Prov. 4:19; 14:12; 1 Cor. 1:18-25, 2:14; Matt. 9:36)
 - Skepticism, Unaware
 - o Spiritual **Stubbornness** (Eze. 12:2; Rom. 10:16, 21; John 8:34-47)
 - Rebellion, secularism
 - o Spiritual **Wickedness** (2 Tim. 3:1-5; Col. 3:5-9)
- II. Opportunities to Connect
 - o Colossians 4:3
 - o **Passions** everyone is excited by something that brings them joy.
 - o **Hurts** everyone gets hurt by someone or something.
 - o **Community** everyone has the desire to belong and have a support system.
 - <u>Conflicts</u> everyone is looking for a resolution to some type of conflict within them or around them.
 - o **Service** everyone has a need that is looking to be filled by someone or something.
 - o Find a need and fill it, Find a hurt and heal it, Find a chasm and Bridge it.

<u>Big Idea</u>

Our mission field is around us everywhere God has us. We must prepare, expect, and engage in opportunities to bridge the gap between lost people and Jesus.

- > Record Make a list of the people who you know are connected to you, but not to God.
- > Pray Pray over the list and ask God to help you see opportunities to build a relationship.
