Who are the vessels of love?

1. Naomi's Loyal Love - v.1-4

Question for Dialogue: Naomi helped Ruth to navigate how Israelite culture handles romantic interest and marriage. It is likely that without Naomi's encouragement and approval, Ruth may not have felt **worthy** to propose marriage to Boaz. **Who is someone who spoke into your life and gave you the confidence to pursue a favorable direction, decision, or goal? How did they do it, and why did their opinion, counsel, or advice matter to you?**

2. Ruth's Loyal Love – v.5-10

Question for Dialogue: Ruth took a **major risk**. There's a saying, no risk, no reward. She had to overcome the uncertainty of Boaz's response before she started moving her feet to act on Naomi's advice. **What situation in your life, whether a romantic pursuit or not, did you have to demonstrate similar faith and trust in God with regard to an uncertain outcome?**

3. Boaz's Loyal Love – v.11-15

Question for Dialogue: Boaz honored Ruth. *Have you ever honored someone? If so, what did they do that was worthy of honor? What actions have you done unto God that you hope after your days are over will be honorable and noteworthy?*

4. God's Loyal Love – v.16-18

Question for Dialogue: Romans 8:28 is applicable in these two verses. Naomi encourages her to “sit still,”... “until you know how the matter will turn out.” **What have you discovered about God while recovering and healing from tragedy?**
