FORMATION: YOUTH & ADULTS YOUTH

Children's Chapel: For children ages 4 to 9 years old during the 8:45 Sunday service. Children follow the leader with a banner down the aisle and return to the church in time for Holy Communion. Youth Sunday School: An educational opportunity on Sunday mornings between services for kids of all ages from our Play & Pray group (2 & 3 year old) through high school. Classes are age appropriate and designed to strengthen the spiritual lives of our younger parishioners. All volunteers "team teach" meaning you are paired with another volunteer, and you present a prepared lesson every other week during the fall and spring semesters (usually 4 weeks per semester total). Youth Confirmation Classes: Preparation for confirmation, the rite at which a baptized person affirms their Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the Church, for teenagers in $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grades. LITURGY & WORSHIP

Choir: Music at St. Luke's is a major part of our worship experience at both the 8:45 more contemporary service and the 11:00 traditional one, incorporating a range of music styles and instruments. Master of Ceremonies: Parishioners who coordinate and direct services, usually once or twice a month, as determined by the Rector. These volunteers must have a strong commitment to the Liturgy, able to think quickly "on your feet", be able to communicate with clergy, and supervise acolytes. Ushers: Men and women who greet and assist worshipers as they enter the church. They also hand out bulletins, help seat parishioners, present the elements of the offering, facilitate the collection, and clean pews after each service.
