



2019 Year-to-Date Highlights

- The New Orleans City Council unanimously passed the **Smart Housing Mix** ordinance! GNOHA and HousingNOLA are still working with officials to refine the maps for implementation.
- HousingNOLA released their 2019 Semi-Annual Report, identifying immense lack in affordable housing production this year.
- ❖ GNOHA released the **2019 Legislative Session Bill Tracker** to keep membership updated on moving legislation.
- ❖ In partnership with NewCorp, Chase Bank, NORA, and Jericho Road, GNOHA re-launched **Own the Crescent**, a comprehensive initiative to connect funding for small business and affordable housing developments with funding and capacity building support, as well as connect residents with homeownership opportunities. www.ownthecrescent.org
- ❖ The Office of Community Development has allocated \$3 million to the Soft Second Mortgage Program for 2019.
 GNOHA has been fielding phone calls and emails from interested clients throughout the month.
- Several HousingNOLA committees formed Complete Count Committees with the Census Bureau to ensure that more of New Orleans' residents (and Louisiana residents in general) are counted during the 2020 Census.
- GNOHA launched a Council District Housing Summit Series to work with each Councilmember to bring community together to address neighborhood-specific housing issues in their district.
- **HousingLOUISIANA** held the 2019 Housing Listening Tour to gather housing priorities in each of the regions, in addition to holding the first All-Day Planning Session on in Alexandria, LA to discuss housing issues across state.
- GNOHA Shared Solutions Initiative implemented a pilot health insurance program through Blue Cross Blue Shield. Health insurance packages are now available to all members starting in May. Members must submit all paperwork roughly 15 days prior to health insurance effective date.
