Dear Louisiana Housing Corporation,

Thank you very much for considering the following comments on the 2019 Qualified Allocation Plan. Please see our comments regarding the QAP as follows:

- 1) In the 4% and tax exempt bond section, allow the option for other entities to be conduit bond issuers without needing to prove that the project wouldn't be feasible without another issuer. Remove this paragraph (see item 1 on page 17 of the draft): "4% LIHTCs will only be awarded with the approval and with subsequent closure of tax exempt bonds through the Corporation. LHC may waive this provision provided the development meets the LHC's highest priorities and the development is not feasible without a financing structure that requires tax exempt bond issuance through another entity."
- 2) Allow for exclusions from the TDC cap calculation for extraordinary cost and additional soft money per HUD's guidance. These caps do not reflect the reality of construction costs today, particularly in urban areas. The high costs of property and construction make remaining under these caps attainable only to projects with significant scale, and/or forces developers to make comprises on developable sites, building quality, energy efficiency measures, providing reasonable amenities, and/or unit sizes.
- Make negative features deduct points again or threshold for adjacent only (and not also for being within ½ mile of a negative). This threshold requirement disqualifies most urban infill sites and will also impact non-competitive 4% LIHTC.

We urge the Louisiana Housing Corporation to consider making these changes to the 2019 Qualified Allocation Plan, and hope the LHC will institute the adjustments to create a better functioning program that will allow more affordable housing developers to apply and take advantage of this funding opportunity.
