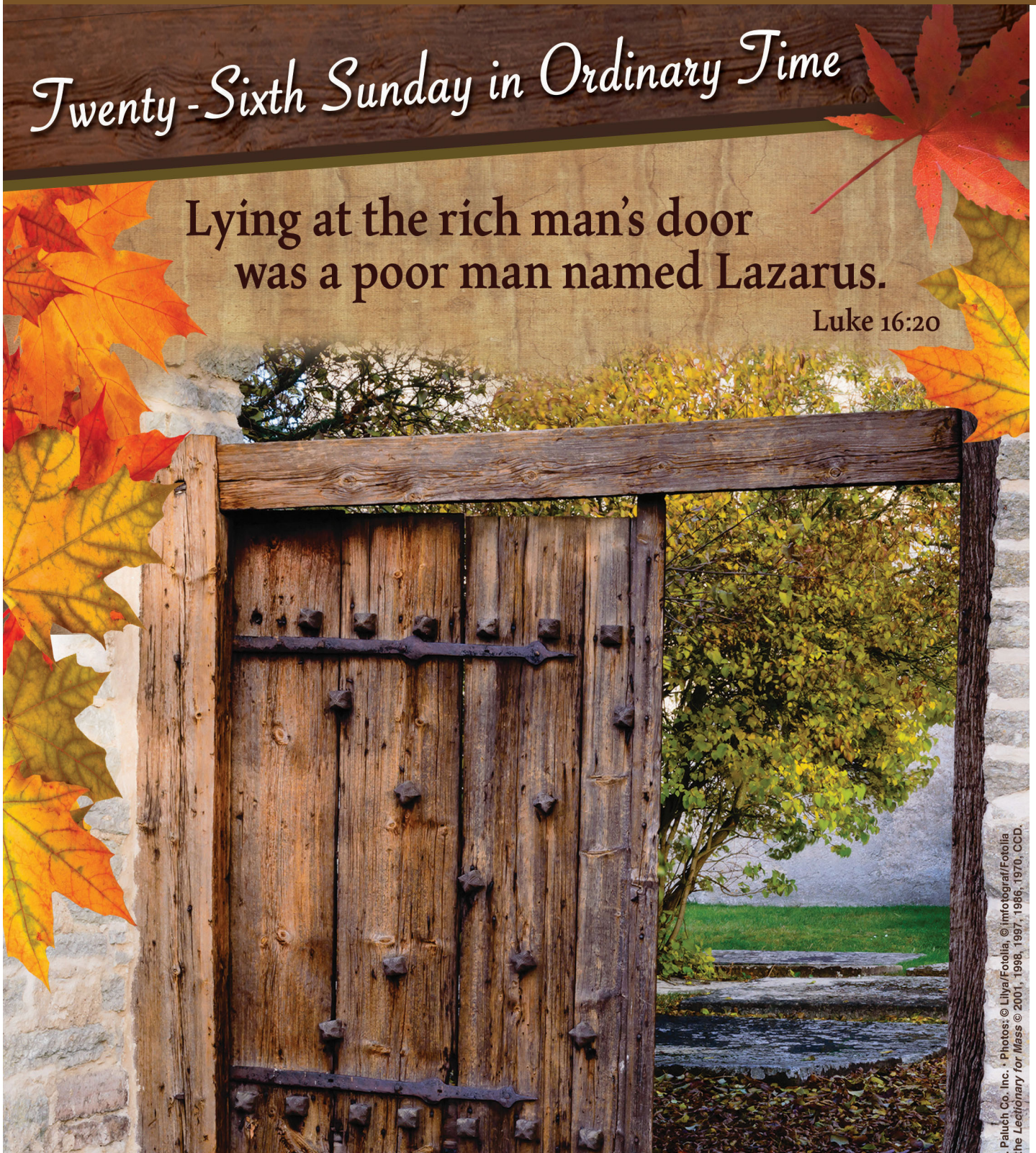

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In Christ,

In Orwell's novel *1984*, the dictatorial government has a slogan which, in part, says "Ignorance is Strength." Ignorance is a strength because the more willful and stubborn one is about not knowing the truth, the more capable they are of believing whatever is convenient at the moment. In *1984* the people could be told two contradicting things by the "Ministry of Truth" from one day to the next without any difficulty in believing either. It was an important part of what is called "doublethink." Similar to some mass media companies today, the "Ministry of Truth" did not inform people of the truth, but rather told them what to think was true; and their willful ignorance made it easy to accept.

Unfortunately, this kind of ignorance does not exclusively exist in fiction. We certainly live in a time where, despite the wide-ranging ways to access information, willful ignorance for the sake of believing what is convenient is common. Many people prefer to be ignorant so that they can persist in their own ideas without question or challenge. Rather than being informed so as to know and believe the truth, some prefer the daily "Two Minute Hate" (in *1984* the "two minute hate" was a media message that incited anger towards those deemed "thought criminals" and enemies of the state, and loyalty to the English Socialist Party, or "Ingsoc").

Many people are willfully ignorant of secular affairs and history; but the ignorance of matters of faith is even more common. Much of humanity chooses to believe whatever is convenient to believe at any given moment. Catholics are not an exception to this. Some of us choose not to inform ourselves on the Church's faith because to do so burdens our ability to remain in error. One of the most obvious examples I can think of is what some people like to believe the Second Vatican Council says, without ever reading the documents to find out that the Council often says the opposite.

There is a way for us to combat this culture of ignorance. Namely, it is to become well informed of facts (secular and religious) and then evaluate them through the prism of all available information from history, science, law, morality, faith, etc., and form an objective, non-emotional belief according to the truth. Christians have an obligation to seek the truth because Jesus promised that the truth sets us free. There is no truth that we ought to fear discovering because to know and believe the truth is to know and believe Jesus, who is "the way, the truth, and the life."

This is why our parish has access to FORMED.ORG. FORMED is an online media library which has study programs, sacramental preparation, talks on religious topics, movies, and books. All these are available, free of charge, for all members of our parish. All you have to do is go to FORMED.ORG/signup on your browser; type in "Most Blessed Sacrament Baton Rouge" and find our parish. Then you register with your email address and login. Once you have an account you have access to everything on your computer, and on an app for most smart devices and media platforms.

I strongly encourage everyone to make use of this program. Do a bible study with friends. Watch a movie about a saint for family movie night. Download and read a book about history or faith. Listen to informative and encouraging talks during long drives in the car. Ignorance is not really strength. It is a way by which we are held back from excelling and becoming freer. Let's make use the tools we have to learn the truth, so that then we might know the Lord better. "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32).
