January 1, 2023

Let us strive to be pure and holy like our Heavenly Mother. All mothers want their children to inherit or acquire their good qualities. Our Heavenly Mother is no exception. With Joseph, she succeeded in training the Child Jesus, so that He grew in holiness and in "favor before God and man." Hence, our best way of celebrating this feast and honoring our Heavenly Mother would be to promise her that we will practice her virtues of Faith, obedience, purity and humble service. In this way, we will be trying to become the saintly sons and daughters of our Heavenly Mother, the Holy Mother of God.

In Christ,

Next weekend, January 7/8, we will celebrate The Epiphany. This feast celebrates God's revelation to the nations through Jesus, and commemorates the Magi's visit to the new born Christ as the first of the gentiles to come to Him. In relation to their visit and the gifts they brought, this feast has many customs associated with it. Several blessings are proper to this feast, such as the special blessings of salt, water, chalk, homes, gold and incense. The Epiphany blessing of water is a beautiful ritual. It is believed that Epiphany water is a strong sacramental to be used against works of evil and illness.



The blessed chalk is traditionally used for the blessing of homes on Epiphany. The blessing is written above the main entrance of the home. It recalls the visit of the Magi to worship the Christ Child in the presence of the Holy Family. The inscription that goes above the door calls on the Magi by name – *Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar* – by placing their initials within the year of that blessing: 20+C+M+B+23. It is also popularly believed that the Magi's initials stand for "Christus mansionem benedicat" ("Christ bless this house").

This is an ancient tradition that places God at the entrance of your home, and places your entire family under his protection. It is also believed that the blessing brings many graces upon those who practice it and is an added protection against spiritual enemies.

After the 4:30PM Mass on Saturday January 7th I will be doing the ritual blessing of Epiphany water and chalk. Everyone is invited to join us for this beautiful blessing that will include singing of psalms. You may bring your own salt and water if you would like. Small bags with the salt, water, and chalk will be made available after the blessing. It will include directions on how to bless your own homes with the Epiphany prayers.
