HB 534	Prohibits discrimination against religious groups on college campuses	by Rep. Mark Pody / SB 802 Sen. Mae Beavers The bill prohibited any <i>public</i> college or university under the auspices of the University of Tennessee system or Board of Regents from discriminating against religious student groups by interpreting its non-discrimination policy in such a way as to require religious organizations to allow any student to be a voting member of the organization or student officer, <i>even if that student does not share the organization's religious belief.</i> Increasingly, colleges are refusing to recognize student religious organizations as official campus ministries if they adhere to the belief that sexual intimacy should be confined to marriage. Passed.
HB 1129	Teaching foundational documents (Version delaying Common Core)	The filed version of the bill required emphasis on American foundational instruments and instruction in American historical achievement. However, on the House Floor, provisions were added that delayed the implementation of Common Core curriculum and the PARCC testing. This version of the bill was the first passed by the House on 3/13/14, and that is why it is scored. The Senate never voted on this version of the House bill. Passed.
HB 1129	Teaching foundational documents (Final Version, Common Core provisions REMOVED)	by Rep. Timothy Hill / SB 1266 by Sen. Frank Niceley requires emphasis on American foundational instruments and instruction in American historical achievements. Passed.
HB 1906	Allows LEAs to teach and celebrate traditional winter celebrations	by Rep. Andy Holt / SB 1425 by Sen. Stacey Campfield allows LEAs to teach the history of traditional winter celebrations; allows students and staff to use traditional greetings of such celebrations; and allows LEAs to display winter celebration scenes or symbols under certain conditions. Passed.
HB 2249	Restructures Textbook Commission and textbook approval process	by Rep. Glen Casada / SB 1602 by Sen. Mike Bell – restructures the textbook commission and the textbook selection process by having members appointed by the two speakers and Governor, not just the Governor. Passed.
HB 2167	Requires Dept. of Ed. and LEAs to notify parents of mandatory testing	by Rep. Sheila Butt / SB 2404 by Sen. Joey Hensley requires notice to parents by the Department of Education and LEAs of information concerning state and LEA-mandated tests, the purpose of the test, and anticipated dates for testing. Passed.
HB 2453	Requires LEAs to make all teaching materials readily available to parents	by Rep. Judd Matheny / SB 2559 by Sen. Janice Bowling requires local boards of education to make policies that will authorize parents or guardians to review all teaching materials, instructional materials, and other teaching aids, as well as all tests developed and graded by the teacher of their student. Passed.
HB 1547	Religious Viewpoints Antidiscriminaation Act for high school students	by Rep. Courtney Rogers / SB 1793 by Sen. Ferrell Haile "Religious Viewpoints Antidiscrimination Act" prohibits discrimination or punishment for any student's expression of a religious viewpoint if the local school allows non-religious viewpoints on the subject at issue, including in academic assignments; authorizes LEA to establish a neutral policy governing situations in which students have an opportunity to speak; requires approval and promotion of religious student clubs in the same manner as non-religious clubs. Passed.
